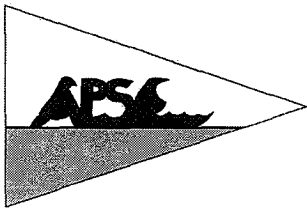

On behalf of the officers and members of The Aquatic Park Sailing Club, I am pleased to enclose our reciprocal card and extend an invitation to you and your members to visit us during the 2015 season.

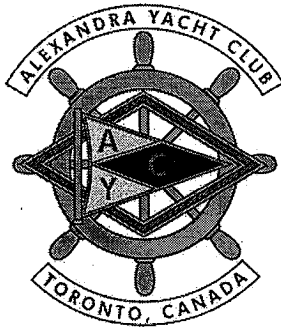
You will find the Aquatic Park Sailing Club about halfway down the Leslie Spit, which defines the eastern perimeter of the "outer harbour" within the Port of Toronto. Approximately 100 boats lie at moorings in this sheltered cove within Tommy Thomson Park. During the summer months it is hard to believe that you are only minutes away from Toronto's downtown core.

Visiting yachts from reciprocal clubs are entitled to 3 free nights at an assigned mooring. Additional nights can be accommodated for a fee of \$30 / night. Please note that our facilities do not include water or electrical hookup, however fuel and pump-out are available nearby at the Outer Harbour Marina. Transportation to the city is best accomplished by use of a bicycle or the shuttle, which runs regularly on weekends.

The Commodore, Officers and Members of Bronte Harbour Yacht Club are pleased to offer reciprocal privileges to your members for the 2015 boating season.

Bronte Harbour Yacht Club (www.bhyc.on.ca) is located at the mouth of Bronte Creek approximately 4 nm west of Oakville Harbour in historic Bronte Village. The surrounding area offers, within walking distance, restaurants, coffee shops, pubs, grocery stores and many more amenities to make your stay with us a pleasant one. There is also a chandlery and boat repair services, including haul out facilities in the harbour.

Space permitting, we offer three nights Mediterranean-style mooring at no charge. We can accommodate boats up to 35 feet with draft of up to six feet. An Officer of the Day is on duty in the afternoon on most weekends and Friday evenings – monitoring Ch. 68. If there is no Officer of the Day on duty, visitors are asked to tie up at the Visitors Dock located up the creek just below the Lakeshore Road Bridge and adjacent to the crane, and check in with the bar personnel who will be pleased to assist you with a mooring assignment.

Most slips offer power and water access. Gas BBQs and picnic tables are available at the club, and ice can be purchased from the bar. Our club house offers washrooms, showers, bar, television, and wireless internet access. Pump-out and fuelling (gas and diesel) facilities are available at the Bronte Harbour Outer Marina located at the harbour entrance.

We also extend a special invitation to your racing members to participate in our 14th Annual Bronte Rocks Regatta held on Labour Day week end. Unfortunately we are unable to offer accommodation to non-regatta boats from Friday September 4 to Monday September 7, 2015.

Dear Commodore, Flag Officers and Members of Reciprocating Clubs,

The Board of Directors and members of the Burlington Sailing & Boating Club cordially invite you to visit our Club and enjoy its facilities during 2015; our courtesy card is attached. If you haven't already, please send your reciprocal invitations and courtesy cards to reciprocals@burlbay.com.

We offer one additional free night, over-and-beyond your club's offering, provided slip space is available (and it almost always is). We have advised our members that, when requesting reciprocal privileges at your club, they should be prepared to present their 2015 membership card.

BS&BC is located on the well-protected north shore of Burlington Bay, also known as Hamilton Harbour. The Burlington Canal "lift-bridge" opens on the hour and half-hour for pleasure craft (providing a boat is inside the channel) but it is also affected by commercial traffic. You can check for next lift time by calling "Burlington Bridge" on VHF channel 16.

Our friendly dock attendant monitors VHF channel 68 as does our Officer of the Day who also flies a large club burgee. Temporary *daytime* docking is permitted on the LaSalle pier; overnight docking on the pier is prohibited by City by-laws.

We offer excellent deep, weed-free, safe docking facilities at the LaSalle Park Marina, which is operated by an association of slip owners. The slips have water for washing (not potable) and limited 30-amp power. Use of a complimentary BBQ dock, complete with picnic tables and cover, is available adjacent to the slips. Fresh drinking water is available alongside the pump-out station and mast hoist on the main pier. The use of the pump-out is also complimentary for reciprocal members.

Upon presenting your membership card and registering, a key will be loaned allowing full access and use of the clubhouse facilities including showers, toilets, sailors lounge, gas fireplace, library, microwave and television. Ice is available in the compound on the pier for a nominal fee.

The Club is located a short walk from restaurants, churches and gas stations. Other nearby attractions include the Royal Botanical Gardens, Art Gallery of Burlington and Bruce Trail (Lamb's Hollow & Cherry Hill Gate). Take a stroll along the beautiful picturesque shoreline and park nature trails. You will usually find a willing club member to drive you to pick up the necessities. Visitors are welcome and encouraged to join in all Club events.

Dear Fellow Boater:

On behalf of the Flag and members of the CFB Trenton Yacht Club, I wish to extend an invitation to use of our facilities on reciprocal bases.

If a visitor to our club is from a club with a current reciprocal agreement, they will be offered the same reciprocal offering as extended to our members. If we do not have a record of the current offering then visiting reciprocal members will be offered first night free, with additional nights at a rate of \$30 /night dockage, \$5/night for utilities, and \$15/night moorage, HST not included. Guests, intending to make use of reciprocals should fly their Club Burgee, and will be required to produce a current membership card. Visitors taking advantage of a free night(s) may do so once every 30 days. Visitors without a reciprocal agreement will **not** be offered a free night, and will be charged the above mentioned rates. Requests for long term rates and availability can be submitted in advance to the Manager by E-Mail at cfbtrentonyc@kos.net.

Our Club is located on the Bay of Quinte near the mouth of the Trent-Severn system. A dining facility is available on the base. More restaurants and shopping, groceries and other amenities are a brisk walk or short taxi ride away in the city center of Trenton.

Dock Stewards are on duty daily from June through August, and as required during May and September. Our clubhouse features potable water, a large covered patio with barbecues, and washroom with shower facilities. Docks are available for up to 36 ft. crafts at a depth of 5.5 ft. for most of the year, and each dock has a 20 amp electrical service per boat. Ice, mast-stepping crane, and pump-out are normally available at a nominal charge.

Our bar is open on Wednesday evenings (the Club race night) and on most Fridays. It is also open during most club functions. Check our schedule out on our (un)official website: www.cfbtrentonyc.com

We do have more water depth than reported on the charts and during normal water conditions, the club is able to accommodate drafts up to 5.5 feet until mid-August. If in doubt, give us a call at 613-392-8995 or on VHF 68.

Chart your course for 44 02.51 N x 76 08.47 W for a visit to the eastern end of Lake Ontario and a stay at the Crescent Yacht Club. Each year, many cruising folks from reciprocal yacht clubs around the lake discover the informal hospitality of our club. We'd love to have you join us this year.

Visiting yachts from reciprocal clubs may enjoy their first night's stay at CYC for free. The fee for subsequent nights, up to a maximum of three, is a flat rate of \$25 per night, regardless of boat length. Visitors who wish to stay longer may do so but may be asked to move to the marina in order to make room for new arrivals. We ask that you sign our Guest Register located on the table in the foyer as you enter the clubhouse. You will also find a "drop box" and envelopes for dockage payment when staying for more than one night.

Our space for transient dockage is limited to four boats on our "L" dock immediately in front of the clubhouse. We usually can assure minimum depths of 4 – 6 ft. of water along the wall. Rafting is permitted on the "L." Care is advised if tying up to the outside of the dock with our prevailing SW winds.

Additional transient dock space may be available from Bearup Marine on our grounds at a nominal charge when resident yachts are away cruising. The marina offers fuel, pump-out, ice, and a mechanic on duty seven days a week. Joe Bearup can be reached at [315-649-2150](tel:315-649-2150).

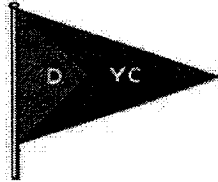

We can generally accommodate boats up to 5' 6" draft. However, later in the season it would be advisable to check first before entering if your draft exceeds 5' 0".

The service dock, where the mast crane is located, is reserved for visiting boaters on a first come first served basis. There is a sign in book located in the clubhouse. If a member is present you may be directed to a member's dock or mooring if one is vacant. Please show your membership card if a member is present and also note it in our book.

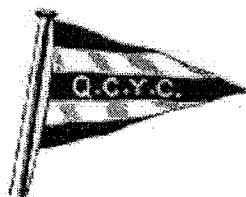
